This 2018 Col d'Orcia Brunello di Montalcino comes from the hotter south-western part of the appellation near Sant'Angelo in Colle and this particular estate is very near to the Orcia river. These wines tend to be uncompromising and austere when young. This 2018 is a darker, blacker color than many 2018s. The aromas are a little earthy with leafy, green notes and bramble fruit. On the palate the tannins are very firm-edged. This is a much more traditional style producer whose wines do not show their best until they are 20 years old or more. The wines can look very flat when they are young. In November 2022 at the winery, I tasted Col D'Orcia Riserva 1968 which was looking fresh and lively and drinking beautifully, so you may need plenty of patience! February 2023
